Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Karamjeet Singh, the Chairperson of the Committee welcomed all the members of the Committee. Thereafter, he gave his opening remarks and shared the activities of the University with the Committee members.

Chairperson's Opening Remarks about University activities:

- (i) The Chairperson apprised the Committee members regarding the quality initiatives taken by various departments of the University. He informed the Committee members regarding the new academic initiatives and the different Programmes being offered by the Schools during Session 2023-24.
- (ii) Another achievement of the University is that university is offering number of Certificate and Diploma courses to the students of Government Colleges, aided colleges and private colleges of Punjab. These skill based Certificate/ Diploma Courses are run under the affiliation with JGND PSOU. The response of students studying in these colleges has been overwhelming.
- (iii) The University has signed MoUs with Uttarakhand Open University (Uttarakhand), Young Progressive Sikh Forum (YPSF) and Sant Longowal Institute of Engineering and Technology, Longowal, Punjab (SLIET) to boost the academic initiatives and processes in the university during the academic session 2023-24.
- (iv) The Chairman lauded the faculty and the staff for organizing various workshops/webinars/FDPs/Conferences during the academic session 2023-24.
- (v) The Chairman apprised the committee members that under the 'Sikhya Daat' Programme (as a CSR), this year a total number of 121 candidates were admitted in various programmes and a total number of 126 differently abled candidates were admitted in various programmes during 2023-24.
- (vi) A total 650 course content videos of different courses have been prepared by the faculty for the teaching of different programs of study to the students.
- (vii) It is worthwhile to mention here that JGNDPSOU is at No.3 among the Govt. Universities of Punjab and falls under Green zone (actively participating) as per the report of UGC on the Digilocker portal, conducted in the month of April-2024.
